

## Interview

A word from our local gardening expert: Sarah Meyer from Daman Court

Q: What's your background?

A: I have a Cert III in Horticulture from TAFE. I worked in retail garden centres for about 10 years and have had a lifetime growing up surrounded by gardening families.

### Tip 1: How to prepare soil over winter.

Grow a green manure crop (a special winter tolerant mix of legumes. Garden centres sell "green manure" seeds). Plant these now and when they're about a foot high 'dig it in'. That provides the soil with a fresh nitrogen source and improves structure of sandy soils which is very important for us here in Cremorne. Another way is to add sheep manures or other manures to slowly break down over winter. They add more nutrients.

### Tip 2: What to plant now?

- Garlic - plant now to harvest in late Nov/Dec.
- Leek, onions, spring onions.
- Any brassicas - broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage.
- Broad beans. (Other beans & peas need more warmth in the soil).
- Silverbeet & winter spinach.
- Asparagus, rhubarb, artichokes.
- Late June - bare rooted fruit trees.
- July/August - bare rooted strawberry runners, raspberries, other berries.



## Pipe Clay Coastcare Group

Recently, the regional body Natural Resource Management South (NRM South) announced successful recipients of its Naturally Inspired Grants. These grants will support 15 groups with \$72,500 towards projects across the Southern Region. This year's projects address a range of challenges such as marine waste management, coastal and wetland restoration, environmental education, shorebird protection and monitoring, weed control, vegetation and habitat protection. The grants were exceptionally high in calibre and NRM South allocated additional funding to endorse the highest ranking projects.

We're pleased to report that the Understorey Network secured a \$5,000 grant to undertake on-ground works and management strategies that will increase the habitat of threatened *Eucalyptus morrisbyi* on Calverts Hill, Cremorne. The Pipe Clay Coastcare group looks forward to supporting the Understorey Network with their work. We'll keep you posted with their upcoming activities and call for participation when help is needed.
