The Spring Veggie Garden by Sarah Meyer

The weather is beginning to warm and with the daylight hours steadily increasing it is time to begin early Spring planting in the veggie garden. Now is the time to plant seedlings of cabbage, cauliflowers, celery, broccoli, lettuce, silver beet, salad onions and leeks into those soils that you have prepared over Winter. If you're starting from scratch, just dig some composted manures and blood n' bone in prior to planting to boost seedling growth.

Seeds of carrots, beetroot, parsnip, silver beet, cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, lettuce, kohlrabi, Summer spinach, swede, turnip, Asian greens, coriander and other garden herbs can be sown directly into garden beds.

Early producing varieties of potatoes can now be planted into deep troughs, hill soil over leafy shoots as they emerge to protect from late frosts. Plant early-producing peas now – they should be ready for Christmas!

If you have a glass house you can begin to sow tomato, pumpkin, zucchini, squash and sweet corn. These can be planted out in the garden towards the end of October. In November plant cucumber, eggplant and capsicum seedlings, also sow seeds of bush and climbing beans.

Creating compost.....is much easier than you may think (and makes the best garden fertilizer)! Add your kitchen scraps (minus the meat and potatoes) to lawn clippings, garden pruning and weeds. Add in some straw or shredded paper and manure. Turn the pile every so often and water occasionally to keep it moist and before the end of Spring you'll have your first composted garden soil ready to use! Tip: add some soil to the mix at the start to introduce composting microorganisms.

Tidelines Interview with Jules Dyson

Special bags are being made as part of a breast cancer awareness campaign which evolved from the Cremorne craft group of 8 ladies who meet weekly. A percentage of the earnings from the Spring Art Market will go to the Pink Lady breast cancer support group. There are a couple of ladies in the community who have breast cancer. The bag making gives the craft group a focus.

Q. What is special about the bag design?

A. It's a bag to hold the drainage bottles during the days post mastectomy surgery. The strap goes over the shoulder and sits comfortably under the incision line. This avoids patients having to go home with the bottles in a pillowcase.
